DISS it will be a family-of-systems (FoS) solution comprising two components: the Joint Verification System (JVS) and the Case Adjudication Tracking System (CATS). Together, these systems will manage the adjudication process for security clearances and suitability determinations for all Department of Defense (DoD) employees, military personnel, civilians, and contractors.</p>
